the illegal movement of people, typically for the purposes of forced labor or commercial sexual exploitation.









Domestic Servitude Organ Harvestir

- Sexual Exploitation is the use of a person who
 is trafficked for the purpose of sexual acts and
 who is controlled by violence, threats, substance
 abuse, deception or grooming.
- Forced labor is work done involuntarily under the threat of a penalty such as violence or harm to the victim's family and often unable to leave.
- Domestic Servitude is the use of a person who
 is forced to provide services with the obligation
 to live on/in a property without the possibility of
 changing those circumstances.
- Organ Harvesting is the use of a person who
 is trafficked and specifically chosen for the
 harvesting of organs or tissues, such as kidneys,
 liver, etc. without consent, to be sold.

This event is for anyone who is interested in learning more about human trafficking and keeping your family and friends safe in their community. You will learn about trafficking, forms of exploitation, how to identify trafficking, what to do if you suspect trafficking is taking place, and learn how the church can make a difference in your community.

Ben Cooley, CEO Hope for Justice

Ben Cooley co-founded Hope for Justice in the UK in 2008 to bring an end to modern slavery and human trafficking. He rapidly grew it into a multi-award-winning non-profit with strong links with

governments and law enforcement, with a mission to bring an end to modern slavery by rescuing victims, restoring lives and reforming society.

Cooley is now a sought-after speaker all over the world, and his expertise is regularly called upon by broadcasters and news media including the BBC and CNN.

Recent speaking events in the US alone have included Life Church, Memphis and the Jesus Culture 'Kingdom Come' tour, as well as GateWay City Church, San Jose and The Church LV in Las Vegas.

Cooley's message of hope, his passionate belief that freedom is worth the fight, has resonated with the thousands who have heard him speak, and his profile continues to grow.

As Hope for Justice's successes multiplied and the number of lives rescued rose, so too did the caliber of people Cooley attracted to work with him.

His team now includes former senior federal investigators and detectives, a former member of the UK National Police Chiefs' Council, lawyers, social workers, and communications and policy experts.

Cooley has a vision to live in a world free from slavery, and the passion, skills and leadership to rally the financial and human support that fighting this horrific injustice requires.



Richard Schroebrel, Head Investigator Hope for Justice

Richard Schoeberl, Team Leader, TN Investigative Hub, holds a Ph.D. in criminology and terrorism, has over 22 years of law enforcement experience, including the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and the Central Intelligence Agency's National Counterterrorism Center (NCTC). He has served at a variety of positions throughout his career, ranging from supervisory special agent at the FBI's headquarters in Washington, D.C., to Unit Chief of the International Terrorism Operations Section at the NCTC's headquarters in Langley, VA.

Before his managerial duties at these organizations, he worked as a special agent investigating violent crime, international terrorism, terrorist financing, and organized crime. He also was assigned numerous collateral duties during his FBI tour – including a certified instructor and member of the agency's SWAT program. In addition to the FBI and NCTC, he is an author and has served as a media contributor for Fox News, CNN, PBS, NPR, AI-Jazeera Television, AI Arabiva Television, AI Hurra, and Sky News in Europe. Additionally, he has authored numerous articles on terrorism and security.

Isaac Jones is the US Regional Development Manager for Hope for Justice. He is an experienced public speaker, communicator and leader, having worked in church planting, youth engagement and ministry, and church co-ordination.
