Opening Session: The 43rd Session of Holston Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church (and the 187th Session of the Holston Conference, founded in 1824) was called to order at 10 a.m. by Bishop James Edward Swanson, Sr., following the Laity sessions and Clergy sessions which were held at 8:30 a.m.

The session opened with the traditional singing of “And Are We Yet Alive?” led by Trevor Smith, Oakridge District, song leader, and Douglas Manley, Cleveland District, organist. The Rev. Edward Ellis, Chattanooga District, offered the invocation.

Organizing Motions: The Reverend Daniel H. Taylor, Jr., Conference Secretary, offered the following organizing motions:

Annual Conference Roll Call:

I move that the signed registration cards constitute the roll call and record of attendance. Excused clergy will be noted and recorded in the Journal.

All motions were approved.

Committee on Rules and Order: Brad Scott, Chair of the committee reported that the full report could be found on pg. 122, B.O.R.. Scott highlighted some the recommended changes:

1. To broaden age in Young adult to include 18—35 year olds
2. Change in organization of Conference Leadership groups
3. Move the definition of Committee on Nominations from C.I..1 to B.X.f.
4. Add task forces and their formation
5. Redefine structure of Older Adult Ministries.

Scott also noted to delete bullet number 4 in the report pertaining to adding Leader of Adult ministries to Nurture team as it is not needed.

Scott moved the acceptance of his report. Bishop Swanson asked for questions/ comments. There being none the vote was taken and the report accepted.

Constitutional Amendments: Bishop Swanson presented the 2009 Constitutional Amendments that were passed at General Conference . These amendments must be voted on by each Annual Conference and pass for them to take effect. Those amendments , # 8,9,17,19,and 22, were brought before the conference and voted upon. They were all approved.

Jimmy Carr, director of Lake Junaluska brought greetings from the SEJ and from Lake Junaluska and welcomed Holston Annual Conference to the “Lake” again. He gave thanks to Holston for the new projection system and noted that Holston paid their SEJ apportionments at 100% and their SEJ pledges at 100%. Carr presented Bishop Swanson with a first copy of “Antechamber of Heaven” written by Will Lowry, a retired United Methodist minister. The book is a history of Lake Junaluska.

Announcements: Taylor made announcements regarding lost items and reminding people to keep the doors closed the auditorium in order that the air conditioning might work. Communion servers were reminded to attend a 5 p.m. meeting.

State of Holston Conference and Laity Address; Bishop James E. Swanson, Jr. and Mary Ruth Richards, Conference Lay Leader :

Bishop Swanson and Mary Ruth Richards addressed the conference via video highlighting ministries throughout the Holston. Prior to showing the video, Swanson and Richards, who was on crutches due to a broken ankle, emphasized that the ministries highlighted were evidence of laity led ministries equipped by the clergy. It was noted that the video would be available for local church use.

Some of the highlighted ministries of the video were the new church start, Cokesbury West, Trenton UMC (CH) with their offering Christ and healing and renewal; Nancy Hobbs, community worker in Big Stone Gap; Strength for the Journey, a ministry reaching out to aids patients; Oak Ridge offering Christ through a free medical clinic; St. Andrews Center (CH) and Lennon- Seney UMC, (KN) ministry with the poor; Forrest Ave. UMC,(CH) homeless ministry; Door of Heaven ,Galax, VA , Hispanic congregation; Jeremy La Duke, new contemporary service in Maryville where “no perfect people are allowed. A few highlighted ministries, yet many, many more throughout Holston where the light of Christ is shining to transform the world and the people of Holston are called to “go and make disciples”.

Committee on Finance and Administration: Gary Grogg, President of CCFA and John Tate, Conference Treasurer gave the first part of the report. Attention was called to pg 51, B.O.R. Tate presented a power point presentation highlighting the generosity of Holston people even during the economic downturn. He noted the 5% less giving in 2009 than in 2008, which was at 89% of apportionments. , which led to 2009 apportionments at 84%. The 2010 budget was \$15,157,042 with clergy benefits of \$5,019,000. Direct invoicing of clergy pension and Insurance is projected to cost \$5.7million in 2011, with apportionments at \$10.921 million. It was noted that 13 of 14 conferences of SEJ will be involved with direct invoicing as of 2011. The CCFA offered the following recommendation before the Conference:

“The CCFA recommends that the Holston Annual Conference in 2011 apportion each church 10% of its undesignated operational income on a monthly basis due and payable by the 10th of the month following collections. Each church shall submit a report as outlined in the report by the CCFA 2010 report to the Annual Conference which identifies the total income of the church and any excludable amounts as identified on the remittance form which was also included in their report.”

Bishop Swanson asked for questions. Greg Smartt (CH) asked for clarification on undesignated. John Tate responded. Bobby Black (CH) asked for a comparison between 2010 verses 2011 under this method. Tate explained that without an adopted budget there is no way to compare. Dixie Miller(MO) inquired about backup if 1/12th of the funds were not collected. Tate responded,” with the reserve funds still available”.

Board of Pensions : Patty Muse, Chair, directed the Conference’s attention to the B.O.R. pgs. 72—73 for pension information and pgs. 64—69 for insurance information. She stated that insurance costs were increasing universally, and that they are recommending some increases in the 2011 rates. It is a balance between short term needs and long term plans. Muse asked the conference to turn to page 155 of B.O.R. for Resolution No. 1 submitted by the Holston Conference Board of Pensions relating to Rental/Housing Allowances for retired or Disabled

Clergypersons. Muse moved for the adoption of Resolution 1. Bishop Swanson asked for discussion, there being none, the vote was taken and the resolution approved. Chairperson Muse called on Kathy Parker to be recognized. Kathy Parker will be retiring at the end of December, 2010. On behalf of the Conference and the Board of Pensions, Muse thanked her for all of her hard work. Ms Parker received a standing ovation from the Conference.

Equitable Compensation: Bill Rogers, Chair referred the conference to pg 98 B.O.R. for the full report. The Commission recommends that the minimum salary levels for the year 2011 remain at same levels as they were for the year 2010. The commission has also requested the 2010 operating budget of \$136,000 for 2011 for equitable compensation in a charge, in a mission aid ministry, and in a cooperative parish. Rogers moved for approval of the report.

Bishop Swanson asked for any discussion. There being none, the report was approved.

Carrie Hooper and Sara Phelps offered the blessing for the noon time meal.

Lunch Break at 11:45a.m.

Monday, June 14, 2010
Afternoon Session

Conference reconvened at 1:45p.m. with the singing of “He Leadeth Me”

Bishop Swanson called the session into order and called on Dan Taylor to make any needed announcements.

Two youth came forward to announce that UMC magnets were available for a donation . They “gave” one to Bishop Swanson and to Dan Taylor, for a donation of course.

Reading of the Scriptures: Will Lauderback read from the Book of Exodus: 18: 13—23 and Tina Morgan (CI) read from the Gospel of John 21:15—19.

After the reading of the Scripture lessons, Bishop Swanson announced the video:” State of Holston” was available on line. He thanked Bruce Adams, associate at First Sevierville, and Melanie, his wife for putting the video together.

The Bishop welcomed Bishop Ken Carder who is in charge of the Episcopal Leadership Program. Carder introduced the first area of Emphasis for the Conference, “Developing Principled Christian Leaders.” He said that Wesley ‘s way of formation is through God’s grace and he embodied that principle of leadership. UMC of today resemble the Anglican Church of Wesley’s day than the original Methodist groups. We recognize partnerships between laity and clergy. He introduced Cal Turner, Jr., President and CEO of Dollar General. This company grew into a Fortune 500 company with 7500 outlets from a small business in Kentucky. Mr. Turner said his mission was to give others a better life; that is how his company has grown following that mission . Bishop Carder then interviewed Mr. Turner in a conversational format before the conference. In speaking about leadership, Turner said leadership is “reaching out to others, laughing at self, and getting others not to be so laughable.” He said leaders must have a mission and it must be impossibly inspiring and short and then they must inspire others in that mission. “What you model says more about you than what you say”, said Turner, who found his job intimidating, same as when he was on his knees asking for forgiveness from God .

Turner says, “he wanted to see where God was going and get on board. You must depend on God. On another note he said, “lifelong learning connects the haves with the have nots and the young and old alike.” In his conversation about specifics of faith, he said like clergy becoming real in Christ is important. He wants his pastor to model being certain of salvation, and moving on to perfection. Always be ready to honor God in whatever you do. While growing up, he realized people were going to be watching him all the time, so he had to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ with his life. After a brief question and answer time, Bishop Carder thanked Mr. Turner for coming and sharing with the conference.

Bishop Swanson called for a break at 2:50 p.m.

Conference reconvened after break at 3:05 p.m. with the singing of “O Come and Dwell In Me” led by Trevor Smith.

Board of Ordained Ministry and Wesley Leadership Institute. Reed Shell, Chair of the Board addressed the conference reporting on the Board of Ordained Ministry and Wesley Leadership Institute. He noted the full reports are found on pgs 48 & 50 B.O.R. He offered a word of gratitude to the lay and clergy member of the Board who diligently perform their duties with faith, discernment and grace. He recognized the member of the Board by having them stand. The Board’s primary responsibility is to focus on readiness and effectiveness for leadership, gifts and graces and fruits of the spirit evidence—making sure people are prepared and ready to go into ministry.

Some of the challenges is lack of funds for the Ministerial Education Fund which helps local pastors with Course of study costs, and assists those in seminary with tuition funds. When apportionments are not paid for 100%, the fund suffers. This year the fund was diminished to the point this assistance was in jeopardy. In addition the financial factor is impacting the issue dealing with clergy supply. With the realignment and delayed retirements, and the impact of direct billing, there may be limits on the number of candidates that can be commissioned.

The Board continues working to better understand “effectiveness “ in ministry and strives to provide resources to equip all clergy in being effective servant leaders through cooperation with the Wesley Leadership Institute. He thanked the Cabinet, Bishop Swanson, Dan Taylor, and Sheila Knowles for the enormous role they play in the Board’s work.

Shell moved the adoption of the reports.

Bishop Swanson ask for the vote. The reports were approved.

Nominations: Dan Taylor, Conference Secretary, moved to elect the ushers/tellers that were listed on pg 8 of the B.O.R. He noted an addition to Maryville District, John King. Bishop Swanson asked if ready for a vote. Vote taken, They were elected.

Taylor presented the Nomination Committee’s report which was found of pgs 103—115, B.O.R. Taylor made additions and corrections verbally, which will appear in the Journal as the accurate list. Bishop Swanson asked if the Conference would accept the report as corrected. Report accepted.

Cabinet Report: Don Nation (TA), Dean of the Cabinet, gave the report. He directed the conference to the written report found on pgs 15—17, B.O.R. Nation said that the Cabinet had been very busy this year especially with the many realignments. He stressed that

many of these realignments have had or will have very positive effects, but as a group, cluster, or parish many things can be accomplished that alone we could not accomplish. He expressed some concerns of the Cabinet: additional realignments and appointments based on financial issues ; the half million, (\$500,000.00) in salary packages which have had to be cut from clergy salaries; and the increasing numbers of clergy expressing restricting conditions when they are expected to itinerate. Our appointment system is based upon mobility of clergy, where gifts and graces can be utilized fully where needed. These issues will be pressing over the next coming years.

The Extended Cabinet has recommended: “that an Ad Hoc committee of 10—12 persons be appointed by the Bishop to review the structure and organization of the Annual Conference. The diversely constituted committee would review Boards, Committees, Teams and Task Forces. It would assess the interrelated roles, membership, officer selection process, adopted policies, leadership development plans, lengths of terms of service and general effectiveness. The goal would be to streamline the structure while insuring adequate coverage of responsibilities. The committee would be charged to report to the Annual Conference of 2011”

Timothy Self (MA) asked if the task force could be objective and comprehensive.

Nation continued with the following resolutions:

Church have engaged in merger negotiations and bother congregations voted in favor of the merger in April 2010, therefore be it resolved that the merger be effective June 15, 2010 and that the name of the merged church be Hixson United Methodist Church. Resolution passed, no discussion.

Resolution regarding discontinuance of Bethel United Methodist Church (CH) Whereas, Bethel United Methodist Church was unofficially declared discontinued in 1992, and designated unofficially a preaching station, and whereas the present members have been unable to maintain the church property and discontinues services several months ago, and whereas the District Superintendent has recommended the discontinuance of Bethel United Methodist Church and that the property be abandoned and that the Trustees of Chattanooga District prepare a quit claim deed to the heirs of the Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church South in the Deed of Conveyance by Tennessee Coal, Iron and Railroad Co. and by Central Trust Company of New York on the 18th day of April 1887; and whereas the consent to discontinue and abandon has been granted by the presiding Bishop, a majority of the District Superintendents and the Chattanooga District Committee on Location and Building and all Disciplinary requirements have been complied with; therefore be it resolved that by the action of t010 session of the Holston Annual Conference Bethel United Methodist Church be discontinued, the property abandoned and that the Chattanooga District Trustees prepare a quit claim deed to the heirs of the Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church South in the Deed of Conveyance by the Tennessee Coal, Iron and Railroad Co. and by Central Trust Company of New York on the 18th day of April 1887. Resolution passed, no discussion.

Resolution regarding discontinuance of East Lake United Methodist Church (CH)

Whereas, East Lake United Methodist Church located in Chattanooga, Tennessee has faithfully served the East Lake community since 1908; and Whereas, the membership has declined over the past several years to four active members , and Whereas, the four active members are unable to maintain the building; and whereas, all members will be transferred to a United Methodist Church of their choice; and whereas, the District Superintendent has recommended the discontinuance of East Lake United Methodist Church and that the property be abandoned and that the property be transferred to the Trustees of the Holston Conference of the United

Methodist Church; and Whereas the consent to abandon has been granted by the presiding Bishop, a majority of the District Superintendents, and the Chattanooga District Committee on location and Building , and all Disciplinary requirements have been met; therefore be it resolved, by the Holston Annual Conference that East Lake United Methodist Church be discontinued t, that the property be abandoned and be transferred to the Trustees of Holston Conference of the United Methodist Church effective June 15, 2010. Resolution passed no discussion.

Resolution to discontinue Forrest Avenue United Methodist Church (CH) Whereas, Forrest Avenue United Methodist Church located at 120 Forrest Avenue, Chattanooga, Tennessee, has celebrated 135 years of ministry, and whereas, the remaining active members determined that they could no longer financially maintain the facilities; whereas, members attending a Church Conference on November 12, 2009 voted unanimously to support a Resolution to Discontinue in accordance with the provisions of para. 2548 of the 2008 Book of Discipline, and whereas, having met all the criteria of Para. 259 of the 2008 Book of Discipline , the members requested on April 19, 2010 that they be designated as a Mission Congregation; whereas the members and ministry to the homeless and poor will relocate to St. Andrews Center; Whereas the consent to discontinue and be designated as a Mission Congregation by the Presiding Bishop, a majority of the District Superintendents, and the Chattanooga District Board of Church Location and Buildings, and all disciplinary requirements have been met: therefore be it resolved, the Holston Conference, in session June 13—16,2010 at Lake Junaluska, North Carolina, does hereby declare the Forrest Avenue United Methodist Church to be discontinued and that the congregation be designated a Mission Congregation ministering to the homeless and poor out of St. Andrews Center and Be it further resolved that the Trustees of Holston Annual Conference be asked to arrange for the sale of all real properties with the proceeds designated in the following way: 30% to Holston Conference for new church starts and the remaining funds to be used to endow the mission of the Mission Congregation under the supervision of the Chattanooga District UMC.

Barry Kidwell, pastor of Forrest Avenue, asked that the following amendment be made by inserting after...the poor at St. Andrews Center , the following: “ contingent upon their Board’s approval. If not approved, the Chattanooga District Superintendent shall choose a temporary location.”

Amendment accepted. Resolution approved with amendment.

Nation concluded the Cabinet report and moved its approval. Report approved.

Nurture Ministry Team: Jeff Wright(CL), Chair, introduced a video showing areas of emphasis in the nurture ministries. The video highlighted ministry with youth, children, young adults, adults, marriage enrichment and leadership training. At the conclusion, Wright called the first class to have completed the course “Leadership Now” to the stage where he presented them with their certificates. Those receiving certificates: Todd Chancey(CL)Walter Cross (KN) Kayte Fox (OA) Vickie Fulkerson (KI)John Grimm (WY) Sandra Johnson (MO) Rebecca Littleton (CH) Roger Mathers (JO) Amy Nutt (CL) Joe Penland (MA) Lori Sluder (KN) Wilma Snyder (WY) Mike Webb (KI)Bobby Barton, Leanne Robertson (JC), Sonia Widener (AB).

Laura Lambert presented certificates to those who had completed “FUEL Youth Ministry Institute”, a nine month leadership training for those working with youth. It covers topics from

United Methodist theology to administration. Those receiving the certificates were Kayce Castiner, Courtney Dutton, Harrison Hart, and Kerri Heirich.

Conference Colleges: Dr. Rosalind Reichard, President of Emory and Henry College, gave the report on the conference colleges. She highlighted the reports found in B.O.R. on pgs. 144—146: Emory and Henry College; pgs. 146—147 : Hiwassee College, and pg 147—148 : Tennessee Wesleyan College.

Reichard informed the conference about who Emory and Henry is. She described it as a transforming academic community where faith growth is important. She noted that VA Professor of the Year was chosen from Emory and Henry. Emory and Henry is part of the community stressing civic responsibility and service. They received the Presidential award (1 of 6) for the 2009 President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Role for exceptional accomplishment in the category of Service to Youth from Disadvantaged Circumstances. The campus culture focuses on sustainability, Leed certification, looking beyond our need to future. There are Bible studies, mission trips, and spiritual formation activities. Emory and Henry desires that the students have a lasting and profound transformation while there and through the rest of their lives.

Stan Harrison was introduced as the interim President of Tennessee Wesleyan College in Athens. He reported enrollment is up and a search is in progress for the next President.

Jerry Russell, the new President of Hiwassee College reported that 161 year old Hiwassee is healthy, but faculty hasn't been paid since Jan. 1. The Hope Scholarship is back which will help. He asked the conference to first pray for the college. He said, "If Hiwassee lives it will be because of God."

Black College Fund: Courtney Ward reported on Bennett College, one of a few black United Methodist women's colleges. It was founded in 1873 and Ward said her mother was a "Bennett Belle" also. She stressed that because of the Black College fund she was able to attend and others like her.

Francis Asbury Award: Chris Brown presented the 2010 Francis Asbury Award to "one who took the time to spend time one on one with students at the Wesley Foundation at ETSU" for 13 years. The Rev. Jerry Everley, this year's recipient came forward to a standing ovation. Rev. Everley will be retiring this year as Director of Wesley Foundation this year.

Bishop Swanson called for a break at 4:25 p.m.

Conference reconvened at 4:30 p.m. with the Service of Retirement.

The service of retirement honoring those who are retiring at the 2010 Annual Conference was presided by Bishop James E. Swanson, Sr. with Jean Henderson, previous Conference Lay Leader bringing the message. Serving as liturgists were Mary Ruth Richards, Conference Lay Leader, The Rev. Reed Shell, Chair, Board of Ordained Ministry, and The Rev. John Grimm (WY). Special music was provided by Ms April Hill (KN) and Trevor Smith (OA) and Dr Douglas Manley (CL) was organist. Those retiring in 2010 were seated on the stage with their spouses. They were: Cecil Baxter, Patricia E. Bishop, Jan Buxton-Wade, Robert T. Cantrell, Jr., Herman Cate, Roy H. The Conference reconvened at 7p.m.

Following special music by Mary McDonald , Art Masker, (JO) read the scripture lesson: Hebrews 12:1.

The Rev. Dr. Adam McKee, III brought the message, “Surrounded by Witnesses”.

Bishop Richard Looney was the celebrant for Holy Communion. The servers were the 24 new elders, and retired and active lay and clergy. The service closed with the singing of “Must Jesus Bear the Cross Alone” followed by the blessing by Rev. Dr. McKee.

Tuesday, June 15, 2010
Morning Session

Early morning worship was held in the Memorial Chapel with Rev. Leah Burns (OA) leading worship and Paul Jones (KN) providing music.

The Conference reconvened at 8:30 a.m. with the singing of “Gather Us In.” Reading of Daily Scripture Passage: Palmer Cantler read 1 Corinthians 9:19-23 from The Message, and offered the opening prayer.

Focus #2: New Places for New People and Revitalizing Existing Place. Richard Edwards introduced the Reverends Candace Lewis and Charles Kyker. Rev. Kyker used biblical stories from Luke 15 of the lost sheep, the lost coin and how each rejoiced when found. He described the church as having “missional amnesia” - we have forgotten who we are. The church needs to put Wesleyan faith back into the church by providing incarnational worship by reaching the lost, equipping and celebrating ministry. Rev. Lewis used Isaiah 43:18-19 to talk about how the church is ready to go in a new direction by creating new places. We need to appreciate the past but not to dwell on it. Also, we need to acknowledge God’s ability to work in our church focusing on Acts 5:38-40.

The Conference reconvened from break at 10:00 am with the singing of “Christ for the World We Sing.”

Dan Taylor recognized Betty Hurlock who shared with the conference that this is the first time in 66 years her husband, The Reverend Charles Hurlock, has missed Annual Conference. Taylor also recognized The Reverend Paul Brown, Sr., who is 93 years old and still attending Annual Conference.

Reports dealing with Focus #2: Places to Offer Christ to People Congregational Development & Revitalization: Dwight Kilbourne (CH) reported that the goal of the conference is to start 15 new churches in the next five years. He said that the first church was launched in Hardin County by Cokesbury in September of 2009 and now has an average attendance of 450, First Hillsville started a second campus in 2008 focusing on the youth, and there are three more churches in the incubator.

African American Ministry Team: Leah Burns (OA) and Bill Price (KN) reported the areas of focus are in keeping with the dictates of the United Methodist Church for this quadrennial. They are to develop principled Christian leaders; new places for new people and revitalizing existing places; being in ministry with the poor, and improving health both locally and globally. They also reported that the AAMT will host a day of training and rejuvenation for the first annual summit on August 7, 2010, at Lennon-Seney UMC in Knoxville. They have also created a website (aamt@holston.org) containing information about events, activities and other items of importance.

Witness Team: Ronnie Collins reported on the results from the campaign goal to have 3,000 baptisms on Pentecost. To date, churches have reported 1,115 baptisms by Pentecost. He also reported that April 1-2, 2011 will be the next Conference on Evangelism.

Recognition of Witness Team Grant Recipients: Ronnie Collins recognized the Witness Team Grant Recipients to be: Lake City (OA), St. John’s (MA), Friendsville (MA), and Telford (JO). He asked the conference to pray for these new ministries to continue to bring people to Christ.

Denman Evangelism Awards: Ronnie Collins presented the 2009 Denman Evangelism awards to: Laity Award to Bill Gwenty (MO) who works with prison ministries and has touched the hearts of many; Clergy Award to The Rev. Sarah Wells of Taylor Memorial (JO) whose church has grown 70%. No youth award was given. Conference members were encouraged to send in nominees next year for the awards.

Asbury, Inc.: Maggie Cooper reported that the theme “Offer Them Christ” was appropriate for the services provided by all the Asbury communities and further exemplifies our mission of Providing Freedom and Security with Compassion. A slide presentation was shown of the different services they provide to the residents and where dreams can come true.

Holston Home for Children: Art Masker reported that this year 733 children’s lives have been impacted by a staff of 170, 100 foster families, and 50 adoptive families. Quoting from Jeremiah 29 he talked about providing a safe and warm place for children and providing a relationship with caring adults. He emphasized the three focus areas of Holston Home: 1. To provide every child a warm, safe place to live. 2. To provide every child with opportunity to grow to their own potential and 3. To provide every child an opportunity to be introduced to Jesus Christ. Pastor Sam Puckett, Minister of Spiritual Life, quoted from 1 Corinthians 10:31, Colossians 3:23, and Isaiah 58 to talk about a safe haven where children can come and find love and that God loves them. This year they had 20 professions of faith, and 24 baptisms.

Charles Hutchens was recognized and thanked for his continuing and constant presence out in the Holston churches telling the story of Holston Home for Children.

Bishop Swanson recognized Anne Burkholder, Associate Dean of Methodist Studies at Candler was present at the conference for the day.

Break was called by Bishop Swanson at 10:50a.m.

The Conference reconvened at 11:05a.m. with the singing of “Lord, Whose Love...”(vs. 1,2,& 4) Sam England read Luke 4:16-17, NRSV.

Bishop announced the current amounts for Change for Children: \$31,154.

Bishop Swanson recognized Bishop Lawrence McClusky.

Report from Ministries with the Poor Send off Hands-on-Mission Trucks: Ty Harrison reported the total number of kits shipped to:

Liberia : 3,404, and to Zimbabwe : 3,633 valued at \$232,221. Harrison quoted from Psalm 34:2, “Let those who boast, boast in the Lord that those who are oppressed may hear it.”

Disaster Response: Jim Feltzer reported we have received a Federal Grant to help with our disaster bags. He gave everyone at the conference a green “get ready” bag to be packed with materials listed on the front of each bag so that persons will be prepared to leave their homes when/if a disaster happen. Every local church is asked to have a Disaster Response Coordinator.

Grace Hospital, Haiti:Michael Palmer reported that three out of five buildings were destroyed during the earthquake but the clinic across the street was not damaged and care goes on.

Outreach Advocacy Ministry Team: Report found on page 42 of the B.O.R.,

Change for Children Grant Recipients: Buzz Trexler announced the 2010 grants Abingdon District: Damascus Circuit – Zion, Damascus, and Wrights Chapel UMC

Sheriff’s Kids ministry to the poor.

African University: Danny Howe introduced Artemus Gaye from the African University. Gaye began by saying “you can run but you can’t hide.” He then shared his faith journey concluding with a testimony of what Africa University meant to him and to his faith journey. He thanked Holston for continuing to support Africa University.

The Advance / GBGM: David Malloy reported that in 2009 special designated giving for Holston Conference was \$862,823. Over the last 60 years Holston has given over one billion dollars. Holston also gave \$714,752 to go towards the earthquake in Haiti. He said that 100%

of all gifts go directly to the need. It helps to support United Methodist 300 missionaries in 60 countries. “The world truly is our parish” and Malloy asked churches to covenant with missionaries to give \$5 per year per church member.

Report from Sudan: Danny Howell recognized Steve and Diantha Hodges for answering the call

to live in Sudan and work with the in areas of agriculture and micro economics, and rural health and hygiene. The Hodge’s will be moving August 16, 2009. He then recognized Boo and Phyllis Hankins; Hankins is serving as District Superintendent of Sudan, and Phyllis as an ordained elder is working alongside him as a missionary and is teaching the pastors English as part of her work. As they addressed the conference, the Hankins reported that this past year has been both good and difficult. They reported on the number of bore holes, wells that had been drilled; ten, and the number of new congregations that had been started during this past year: four with two more desiring to become United Methodists. The Hankins are currently on home on furlough from Sudan and be returning in July.

Bishop Swanson thanked the Hankins for their willingness to serve in Sudan.

Bishop Swanson recognized The Rev. Linda Bird Wright for her generous gift for a parsonage and mission house to be built in Sudan. He said that the conference was struggling as to where funds would come from. He said, “ God is calling our church to do miracles, and Linda took a tragedy and turned it in to triumph”. She approached him at the 2009 AC and said she wanted to build the house and call it “The Captain’s House” in memory of her late husband, Walt Wright who died in an accident March of 2009. Wright said that she was just doing what God called her to do, so give God the glory.

Blessing of the Meal: Madison Roe the daughter of Jason & Holly Roe (MO) offered the blessing.

**Tuesday, June 15, 2010
Afternoon Session**

The Conference reconvened at 2:15 p.m. with the singing of “Your Grace is Enough” led by Paul Jones and the Cokesbury Contemporary Band.

Bishop Swanson announced the “Change for Children” offering increased to \$53,223.72 and the mission offering to \$145,598.83.

Focus #3: Being in Ministry with the Poor. Steve Hodges introduced Rev. John Edgar. He said that for anyone to work with the poor they must first develop an authentic relationship. It is important to not place any requirement on the poor but to welcome them, get to know them, talk and pray with them. It is only when they begin to trust that you can take the next step by inviting them to worship. It is the spirit that empowers persons to do ministry.

The Conference was led in the singing of “Mighty to Save” led by Paul Jones. Larry Trotter offered the “Top 10 Reasons You Need a Personal Trainer.”

Break – Non Ice Cream Social: This year the conference in keeping with our emphasis on ministry with the poor and global health omitted the ice cream and water break and asked persons to make a contribution to the hunger ministries within Holston Conference.

The Conference reconvened at 3:40pm with the singing of “Majestic/Open the Eyes of My Heart.” Lauren Wolford read Mark 1:29-34, NRSV.

Nothing but Nets: Erin Gamble reported that Church Street UMC children raised money to purchase 528 nets. They challenge other churches to do the same. Gamble introduced The Rev. Bobbie Kaye Jones from the North Texas Conference. Jones thanked Holston Conference leading a way and setting an example to other conferences. Jones showed a video about “Nothing but Nets.” Margo Jacobs talked about “Imagine No Malaria.”

Improving Clergy Health: Clark Taylor, Deacon, Director of Hospice – Chattanooga, introduced Kelly Piepenbrink, Manager of the Health and Wellness program at the World Health Organization in Chicago. She said that health is a state of complete physical, mental, and social well being not merely absence of disease or infirmity. She talked about the statistical information regarding the health of our clergy and urged them to be concerned about improving their health. She also urged lay delegates to see to it that their clergy took time for their own physical, mental, and social well-being. She stressed that clergy burnout is a serious and real problem affecting all clergy.

Bishop Swanson announced the “Change for Children” offering increased to \$61,932.94 and the mission offering to \$149,552.36.

**Tuesday, June 15, 2010
Evening Session**

Blessing the Meal: Danny Castillo offered the blessing of the evening meal.

Conference reconvened with an Evening Musical Worship Celebration featuring the praise and worship band and team from Cokesbury West featuring worship leader and musician Paul Jones (KN). Larry Trotter (KN) joined the band for a few musical selections. It was truly a celebration and a time of praise for the Lord. Everyone who attended was uplifted and carried the spirit away with them as they departed Stuart Auditorium.

**Wednesday, June 16, 2010
Morning Session**

Early morning worship and a service of Holy Communion began at 7:45 a.m. at the Memorial Chapel with Mr. Randy Hildebrant (MO) preaching and the Reverend Robert A Hayes (MA) providing music and presiding at the table.

The Annual Conference reconvened at 8:30 a.m. with the singing of “Come Christians Join to Sing” led by Trevor Smith (OA). Music provided by organist Dr. Douglas Manley (CL).

Megan Watson read the morning reading from the Scriptures, reading from the Book of Psalms: Psalm 118: 1-9, and 21—29 . It emphasized giving thanks to God for God is good and his “love endures forever”.

Bishop Swanson announced that the Annual Conference would be conducted without a time frame to allow ample time for discussion on important business matters being presented. He said he would periodically give breaks , but would conclude with the sending forth service without a break for lunch. He stressed he hoped we would finish around 12:30.

A video presentation made by the United Methodist Communications was shown. Its theme, “rethinking church” emphasized ways we offer Christ. It was announced that this DVD was available for local church use and hoped it would be utilized to aid in thinking forward on how we do and can offer Christ. The DVD was available from the United Methodist Communications web site.

Personnel Resources Committee report: given by Jim Whedbee (KN), Chair. He announced that the Rev. Laura Shearer (KN), currently a member of the Conference Pastoral Counseling Center staff, would become the Director effective this Annual Conference.

Holston Conference Foundation report: given by its director, Roger Redding. He invited the conference to read the full report as printed in the Book of Reports, pg 141. Redding highlighted the Foundation had an increase of 30 new accounts amounting to \$3.2 million and an overall amount of \$68 million invested in the Foundation. Holston Conference Foundation is the 11th largest foundation overall.

Redding then gave an overview of a few of many people who left financial legacies to the United Methodist Church and to our Lord and the work that has been accomplished by these legacies. He mentioned the stories of Lucile and Earl Winkler who provided seminary scholarships and an endowment for new ministries at Panther Springs; Lawrence (Bush) Holley, a motorcyclist, “a different kind of man,” Redding said who sported a Fu Man Chu beard, who attended Trinity UMC in Greenville. He left money for the cemetery and ministry at Trinity. Others were Ruth Fleishman, scholarships for Hiawasee; Edith Lemming Skinrod, 3 scholarships; Thomas Ware, seminary scholarships.

Stewardship Team report: given by Will Cantrell, Chair. Cantrell showed a video continuing the theme from last year about Ministry man and finance man and how they work together to do the Lord’s work. Cantrell told the conference “Stewardship is like golf; if you want to learn stewardship you need lessons.” He told of two upcoming events in October, 2010 that would teach those lessons, Funding Your Ministry”. He encouraged clergy and laity to attend.

Holston Conference Board of Trustees chairperson Gene Frazier came forward on behalf of the trustees and at the direction of the General Conference and made a motion that Resolution #2 found on page 156, B.O.R. be approved. The motion states,”

Resolution No. 2

RESOLUTION RELATING TO LANDMARKING PROPERTY WITHIN THE BOUNDS OF THE HOLSTON CONFERENCE

WHEREAS, The Conference Board of Trustees brings this resolution at the direction of the General Conference, and under the authority of The Book of Discipline, as follows:

Establishment of Annual Conference Policy with Regard to Government Efforts to Designate Church-Owned Property as Landmarks – The [annual conference] board [of trustees], after consultation with the conference commission on archives and history, or alternate structure, shall develop a policy for an annual conference response, on behalf of any local church, church-related agency, or district or annual conference board of trustees located within the bounds of the annual conference, to any governmental effort to designate a property held in trust for the benefit of The United Methodist Church by any such board of trustees as a cultural, historical or architectural landmark.

¶2514.7 of the 2008 Book of Discipline

WHEREAS, by Discipline, the Conference Board of Trustees is the designated successor in interest to church-owned property held in trust for The United Methodist Church (2008 Book of Discipline ¶¶ 2501, 2548); and is the designated agency to intervene and take all necessary legal steps to safeguard and protect the interests and rights of the Annual Conference anywhere and in all matters relating to property and rights of property of any of its local churches and church-related agencies (2008 Book of Discipline ¶ 2512.4).

WHEREAS, it is the local church's responsibility to properly inform the appropriate District Superintendent of its plans to voluntarily or involuntarily have their property receive landmark designation with the inclusion in a proposed historic district, to seek registration on a historic registry, or to receive such designation that would increase the complexity and costliness of renovating, upkeep, or reconstruction of its existing or proposed facilities.

WHEREAS, once the local church has notified the appropriate District Superintendent, they will seek approval from the appointive Cabinet after consulting with the Holston Conference Board of Trustees.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOLSTON ANNUAL CONFERENCE that the policy titled, POLICY FOR ANNUAL CONFERENCE RELATED TO LANDMARK DESIGNATION OF PROPERTY HELD IN TRUST FOR THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH that it is hereby adopted by reference with a copy filed in the Conference Secretary's office and included in the 2010 Annual Conference Report by the Holston Conference Board of Trustees.

Being a motion from the Board of Trustees at the direction of the General Conference, it required no second. Bishop Swanson asked for any discussion. There being none he called for the vote. The Resolution relating to Landmarking Property within the Bounds of the Holston Conference was approved.

Frazier continued with the Trustees report and stated effective January 1, 2011 all churches will be eligible to be a part of Holston Conference-wide Workers Compensation. The Trustees strongly encouraged each church to participate.

Frazier brought the Trustees' recommendation for policy for discontinuing churches and managing the disbursement of and/or liquidation of assets to the attention of the conference. (Pgs.83—91,B.O.R.) This policy was established as a directive from the General Conference. Mike Roberts (CH) raised a question in regard to pg 88, Part C. regarding "what to do if no members or not enough members." The response was that the determination would be made between the existing congregation and the District Superintendent.

Frazier moved the Trustees report be approved. There being no more discussion the report was approved.

Bishop Swanson called for a 5 minute break at 9:25 a.m.

Conference reconvened at 9:30 a.m. with the singing of "Soldiers of Christ".

Conference Secretary Daniel Taylor announced that along with our Hands on Mission boxes that were sent off on the trucks yesterday, Sweetwater UMC sent lawn mowers, garden tools and Fairview UMC sent plumbing supplies which in total amounted to an additional \$15,000. The total for Hands On Mission Project reached a dollar amount of \$247,221.00 Taylor continued with the Nominations Report. Bishop called for a vote. Nominations Report approved.

Council on Finance and Administration President, Gary Grogg, reported that because of the shortfall of apportionments for 2009 (84.9% received) that \$720,082 had to be taken out of reserves . He noted that this was the second year CFA had to go into reserves to meet conference obligations for a total of \$1.4 million for 2008 and 2009. He recognized the hard economic times which everyone has had during these difficult years and thanked everyone for their generosity. Two budgets for 2011 were drawn up one on the current formula for apportionments and the other based upon the tithe method, which the conference passed earlier. He directed the Conference attention to the copy of the tithe budget.

Based on the tithe method the budget for 2011 recommended by CFA is \$10,801,321.00 and \$5.7 million in direct invoicing for pastors' insurance and pension costs. Of the \$10, 801,321.00 Grogg noted that \$7,804,545.00 were fixed costs, i.e. facilities, equitable compensation and General & SEJ apportionments. That leaves \$2,996,776 available for adjustment, but those are ministry areas. He noted that since this would be our first time operating with the tithe formula, some adjustments might have to be made during the year to the budgets, but CFA would follow the approved policy on amending budget between Annual Conferences.

Grogg noted that there was a 2% increase for Conference Staff employees; however no increases for the District Superintendents who have had no increase in the past two years. He also noted that there was \$200,000 built into the budget to assist churches that might have difficulty with transitioning to the direct invoicing. He encourage 2nd mile giving by those churches whose costs decreased to help the other churches; he reminded churches that special offering Sundays would be designated to support clergy education.

He closed his report by expressing his deep gratitude for John Tate, Conference Treasurer and moved its acceptance.

Bishop Swanson asked for questions directing the questioners to microphones set up in the middle of the auditorium.

Questions: Doug Jennings (MO) inquired where charts of the presentation could be found? “ On web site.”

Christi Taylor (AB) asked if CFA was eliminating MEF funds.

David St. Clair(AB) asked if vote could be taken in three parts: Budget, Process, Special Offerings.

Bethany Douty (JO) asked why staff had 2% increase when many pastors at minimal salary.

Tom Reed (JO) commented that in the past our apportionments were based on fixed and variable costs. This budget is based on the income approach.

There being no further questions, Bishop Swanson asked for a hand vote. Report (including Budget) approved.

John Tate was recognized with a standing ovation. Tate thanked Bishop Swanson and Gary Grogg for their support.

Bishop Swanson commented that we often celebrate the event and not the process. Annual Conference is an event yet there are many who make the process work. Many hours, month, blood sweat and tears put together Annual Conference. He then recognized many of the detail people : Anne Travis, Lori Sluder; the communication Team: Donna Hankins, Annette Spence, Millie Meese ;Dan Taylor, Linda Bird Wright, Mary Parson, Sheila Knowles, Ron Matthews,

Trevor Smith, Paul Jones, Becky Hall, Sarah Slack, Kathie Wilson Parker, Ashley Calhoun, Jay Garrison, our Conference Counselor. He thanked Delphine Swanson, the Bishop's First Lady.

Bishop Swanson recognized Don Nation, who even though retiring, will be going to Morristown District on a half time basis until the newly appointed District Superintendent, Clark Jenkins is able to recover from his current health treatments. Mickey Rainwater, the current District Superintendent will be going to First Broad Street, Kingsport.

Bishop Swanson then recognized Norma Edwards. She had served three bishops when he arrived and wanted to retire. She agreed to stay on for Bishop Swanson. She will be retiring Dec. 31, 2010. He presented her with a bouquet of roses.

Bishop Swanson asked Minute Question #85, "Where shall the next Conference Session shall be held?"

Reed Shell (CL) made a motion that we meet at Lake Junaluska. Motion seconded by Charles Stark (MO). Bishop noted that we were in negotiations about the dates. Motion approved.

Dan Taylor, Conference Secretary, made a motion that the Extended Cabinet carry out the business of the conference until the next Annual Conference. Motion approved.

Bishop Swanson then called upon Charles Maynard (JO) to share his humorous insights as to our life together during this conference.

Bishop Swanson greeted Bishop Mary Virginia "Dindy" Taylor of South Carolina area. He then called for a break at 10:55a.m.

The Conference reconvened at 11:10a.m. Bishop Swanson called order and then greeted Dr. Paul Brown Sr.

The final tally for the Sudan offering received was announced: \$154,627.75.

The Sending Forth Worship Service began with Nicklesville Community Choir singing "Go Light Your World". Mr. Joe Penland did the Call to Worship; Invocation: Rev. Vickie Fulkerson; Bishop Swanson preaching his message "Now That the Fever Is Gone..." and based on scripture from Mark 1:29-31. Bishop Swanson called on the District Superintendent to note any changes to the appointments "The Fixing of Appointments"; Bishop Swanson and Ms. Mary Ruth Richards presented licenses to Holston Conference newly appointed Local Pastors. Blessing given to Clergy and Laity and adjourned the Annual Conference

All seven questions passed with the required majority vote. Bishop Swanson asked the Historic Questions to all the candidates and they responded appropriately. Bishop then closed the session.

Monday, June 14, 2010**8:30 a.m.**

The 2010 Clergy Session of Holston Annual Conference re-convened at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, June 14, 2010, at Shackford Hall, Lake Junaluska, North Carolina with Bishop James E. Swanson, Sr. presiding.

Bishop Swanson recognized Reed Shell, Chair of the Board of Ordained Ministry, who presented the Board's report. Minute Questions 18; 21; 25; 26b; 35b; 42; 45; 46c; 50a,c; 52c; 66; 71; 76a; 80a,c; were taken individually and voted upon with required majority election as noted by the chair with raising of hands or with affirmative voice votes. The remaining Questions required no further action. All persons were elected, approved, or sustained as required after Shell reported affirmatively on the character question. Full answers with all names may be referenced in the Business of the Annual Conference, Minute Questions, in the 10 Conference Journal.

Reed Shell called on the chair of the Fellowship of Associate Members, Sam Johnson, who distributed engraved Bibles to the newly elected Associate Members.

Stella Roberts, Chair of the Division of Elders of the Board of Ordained Ministry, came forward to present gifts of engraved Bibles to the newly commissioned Provisional Members.

With the assistance of Dennie Humphreys, Chair of the Order of Elders, Roberts then presented gifts of a Chalice and Paten set to the newly ordained Elders in Full Connection. Lynn Hutton, Chair of the Order of Deacons, presented the newly Ordained Deacons in Full Connection each with a set of pottery Basin and Pitchers.

Ken Lytton reported for the Fellowship of Local Pastors. He announced that their National Annual meeting will be held at St. Simons Island. He also reminded the Local Pastors of their annual breakfast, Tuesday morning, June 15.

Dennie Humphreys reminded the assembly of the Clergy Gathering at Colonial Heights, Kingsport, on October 25, 2010.

Dan Taylor spoke on the Disciplinary change regarding those who are able to note for delegates to General Conference and Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference in 2011. He noted that Local Pastors who have served two full years after completion of the Basic Course of Study will be

eligible to vote. Taylor then announced the retirement of Sheila Knowles and thanked her for eight years of service as Administrative Assistant in Clergy Services. Grady Winegar came forward to express his thanks for her service during his 2004–2008 quadrennium as Conference Secretary and Director of Clergy Services. The assembly responded with a standing ovation.


