The GCUMM (GCUMM) was created at the 1996 General Conference in response to the need to develop, coordinate, resource and emphasize effective ministries to men in the United Methodist Church. In addition, the office of Scouting Ministries was placed with the GCUMM to coordinate, resource and emphasize ministries to youth through Scouts and other youth-serving agencies.

The mission of the GCUMM is to assist men to know Jesus Christ, to serve Him, to grow spiritually and seek daily to do His will. GCUMM consists of 25 voting members. United Methodist Men exist to declare the centrality of Christ in every man's life.

Charter

United Methodist Men operate on the premise that men can and will accomplish more when they belong to a dynamic team or organized group. Through the Charter system, United Methodist Men become a collective team capable of accomplishing tremendous things for Jesus Christ. Here are a few of the great outreaches that occurred because of the joint efforts of United Methodist Men.

In 2009, United Methodist Men, in cooperation with the Society of St. Andrew, provided over 81 million servings of food to hungry people free of charge.

In 2009, the lives of over 370,000 plus youth were touched through civic youth programs housed in 6,700 United Methodist churches. United Methodist Men have promoted and supported Scouting since 1981.

In 2009, over 30,000 prayer requests each month were answered through the Upper Room Living Prayer Center.

When your organization becomes a chartered United Methodist Men unit, you will learn about the tremendous ministries that other devoted Christian men are engaged in across the nation and around the globe through *UMMen* magazine. The *UMMen* magazine/newsletter keeps you in touch with inspirational resources, ministry ideas and personal development tips for men.
