



The unconfirmed first burial in the old cemetery was on August 19, 1848 of Isaac Upton. Veterans from many different wars are buried here. There are about 400 marked and 125 unmarked graves.

The old cemetery has been used for years as a community cemetery. The old cemetery predates the adjacent Vonore United Methodist Church building by roughly 50 years.

The cemetery is used as a reference point in the deed transferring the land to the church on which the church stands.

The new cemetery is located on the far West end of the old cemetery. It was created when there were no plots left in the old cemetery. Cousins, John F. Hall and Bart Hall bought part of the adjacent Duckett farm and the new cemetery was founded.

The new cemetery was laid out with iron pins marking each lot and a plat was made showing available lots as well as lots that had been sold.

There are family plots available for sale in the new cemetery.
